

Manipur

1. The Installed Capacity of Manipur as on 31.9.2016 was 209.74 MW. In the total installed capacity of the Manipur, the share of State Sector was 41.45 MW & Central Sector was 168.29 MW whereas Private Sector contribution was nil in Manipur.
2. The peak demand deficit of Manipur was 1 MW (0.6%) and energy deficit was 30 MU (3.6%) respectively during 2015-16. Peak demand deficit of Manipur was lower than the national average (3.2 %) whereas energy deficit of Manipur is higher than the national average (2.1%) during same period. The State Government needs to increase State sector install capacity to meets its energy deficit.
3. The average AT&C losses of Manipur was 71.49% during 2014-15. However, Manipur has projected to reduce the AT&C losses at 22 % level by 2021-22.
4. Manipur has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) under the Scheme UDAY – “Ujwal DISCOM Assurance Yojana”. The Scheme – UDAY has been launched to improve financial and operational efficiencies of power distribution companies (DISCOMs).
5. As per 2011 census, there were 2379 villages in Manipur. Out of 2379 villages 2215 (93.10%) villages were already electrified till date. The balance 164 un-electrified villages electrified through grid (all Awarded).
6. Manipur has 3.35 lakhs rural households. Out of 3.35 lakhs rural household, 2.27 (67.7%) lakhs households has been electrified till date. The balance rural households to be electrified are 1.08 Lakhs. The State Government needs to accelerate the household’s electrification as only 67.7% households are electrified till date.
7. R-APDRP scheme has been subsumed in Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in November 2014. Under this scheme, 13 towns are covered under Part-A of R-APDRP and 30% funds have been released whereas 13 towns are covered under Part-B of R-APDRP and 64.7 % funds have been released as on date. The work progress is slow. The State Government

should accelerate the work progress of R-APDRP for financial health of power sector.

8. Meanwhile, 12 towns are covered under Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in Manipur. The However, Government of India has approved Rs. 129.43 crore for 12 towns. Out of which Rs. 110.02 crore is approved as grant for these towns whereas Rs.11 crore grant released till now.
