

## Andhra Pradesh

1. As on 30.09.2016, the total installed capacity (including allocated share in joint and central sector utilities) of Andhra Pradesh is 15762.94 MW. In the total installed capacity of the Andhra Pradesh the share of State Sector is 5169.68 MW & Private Sector is 8992.79 MW whereas Central Sector is 1600.46 MW.
2. The peak demand deficit of A.P was 9 MW (0.1%) and energy deficit is 70 MU (0.1%) during 2015-16. However, the peak demand deficit and energy deficit was lower than national average (2.1%) and (3.2%) respectively during the same period.
3. The average AT&C losses of Andhra Pradesh was 10% during 2014-15. However, Andhra Pradesh has projected to reduce the AT&C losses at 8 % level by 2021-22.
4. As per 2011 census, there were 26286 villages in Andhra Pradesh. All villages are already electrified.
5. Andhra Pradesh has 89.97 lakhs rural households. Out of 89.97 lakhs rural household, 87.88 (97.6%) lakhs households has been electrified till date. The State Government needs to accelerate the household's electrification as only 97.6% households are electrified in the State.
6. Andhra Pradesh is one of the three States in the country selected for Power for All (24x7), a prestigious program of Government of India. This program is being implemented jointly by Government of Andhra Pradesh and Government of India & the joint statement was signed on 16th September, 2014 & the program was launched on 2nd October, 2014. The Government of Andhra Pradesh requires Rs.18311 crore (around USD 3052 Million) for the Distribution Network Capacity Addition for the Power for All (24x7) programme.
7. 75 towns are covered under Part-A of R-APDRP and 56 % funds have been released whereas 46 towns are covered under Part-B of R-APDRP and 15%

funds have been released uptill now. The work progress is slow. The State Government should accelerate the work progress of R-APDRP for financial health of power sector. This scheme has been subsumed in Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in November 2014. The State Government should utilise the funds available under IPDS for improvement of Power sector.

8. Meanwhile, 88 towns are covered under Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in Andhra Pradesh. However, Government of India has approved Rs. 582 crore for 88 towns. Out of which Rs. 494.70 crore is approved as grant for these towns whereas Rs. 49.47 crore grant released till now.
