

Telangana

1. As on 30.09.2016, the total installed capacity (including allocated share in joint and central sector utilities) of Telangana is 11678.76 MW. In the total installed capacity of the Telangana the share of State Sector is 7052.25 MW & Private Sector is 2756.01 MW whereas Central Sector is 1870.50 MW.
2. The peak demand deficit of Telangana was 5 MW (0.1%) and energy deficit was 306 MU (0.6%) during 2015-16. However, the peak demand deficit and energy deficit was lower than national average (2.1%) and (3.2%) respectively during the same period.
3. The average AT&C losses of Telangana was 13.13% during 2014-15. However, Telangana has projected to reduce the AT&C losses at 12 % level by 2021-22. The cabinet has approved UDAY scheme in November, 2015 for financial restructuring of sick DISCOM. Telangana is yet to give its consent to participate in UDAY scheme.
4. All villages in Telangana are electrified.
5. Telangana had 52.49 lakhs rural households. Out of 52.49 lakhs rural household, 45.32 (86.3%) lakhs households has been electrified till date. The State Government needs to accelerate the household's electrification as only 86.3% households are electrified till date.
6. Telangana is one of the States in the country selected for Power for All (24x7).
7. 38 towns are covered under Part-A of R-APDRP and 59 % funds have been released whereas 37 towns are covered under Part-B of R-APDRP and 15% funds have been released uptill now. The work progress is slow. The State Government should accelerate the work progress of R-APDRP for financial health of power sector. This scheme has been subsumed in Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in November 2014. The State Government should utilize the funds available under IPDS for improvement of Power sector.
8. Meanwhile, 67 towns are covered under Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in Telangana. However, Government of India has approved

Rs. 650.31 crore for 67 towns. Out of which Rs. 390.19 crore is approved as grant for these towns whereas Rs. 39.02 crore grant released till now.
